Why is Hispanic Heritage Month important to you?

Hispanic Heritage Month is important to me as it allows recognition to a diverse culture community in the US, with many generations who have contributed so much to our country's history.

Personally, as a Mexican American, the celebration kicks off at a perfect time on September 15, which is the eve of Mexican Independence Day, a day that is often confused with Cinco de Mayo, which has become a more popular date in the States. Celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month in the same month as Mexican Independence Day allows a spotlight on this historical day, while educating us on its real significance.

Hispanics represent 19% of the U.S. population, yet only 12%* of those working in our industry. Do you have any suggestions for making our sector more representative of our national demographics?

I listen to Spanish TV and radio stations regularly, and often hear plaintiff law firm ads that negatively position our industry. Unfortunately, some people then think that insurance is not a welcoming place for Hispanic job seekers. So it's important for those of us working in insurance to help dispel those impressions and create confidence in the benefits of building a career in this industry.

Our industry could be marketed more, on an encouraging level, especially in colleges with high Hispanic enrollment, allowing insight of promising career paths with mentors/support and describing the different types of
