

A Closer Look at Community Giving

Because of the pandemic, in-person employee volunteerism came to a halt. Though we missed those touchpoints with the organizations that mean the most to us, we were fortunate to still be able to contribute financially, and in some cases, virtually. Things may have looked a little different in 2020, but we were once again amazed and inspired by the range of charitable efforts supported by our employees and producer partners. 
Supporting our Communities through Covid-19

The well-being of our employees and customers is a top priority. When Covid-19 hit, we remained committed to helping our communities be resilient during this challenging time. Thanks to our parent organization Intact Financial Corporation, we were able to donate \$200k to Feeding America, the nation's largest hunger-relief organization that supports food banks throughout the country. Additionally, \$300k was contributed to local efforts within those communities where our employees live and work. Our goal was to assist organizations in areas of need, such as hunger and health through this pandemic. We asked each of our offices to host virtual engagement activities with their colleagues so everyone had the chance to participate in selecting an organization. Through videoconferences, calls and online surveys, our 22 offices donated to 48 worthy causes throughout the United States.

Standing Up for Social Justice

Early summer, our home office city of Minneapolis was in the global spotlight due to the tragic death of George Floyd. It was time for us to come together and live our values. Intact committed \$500k in donations for two nonprofits targeting racial inequality through youth education – Pathways to Education in Canada and Northside Achievement Zone (NAZ), in the U.S., which was identified by our employees based in the Twin Cities. NAZ serves the North Minneapolis neighborhood, addressing generational poverty and helping low-income children of color graduate from high school, college- or career-ready. In addition to this larger contribution, a matching gift was made available to augment employee donations. In total, \$225k was donated to the Northside Achievement Zone. We're excited to go beyond this sponsorship and become directly engaged with NAZ's efforts through volunteerism and more.





Intact Scholarship Program

For the 17th consecutive year, Intact Insurance Specialty Solutions has awarded scholarships to 16 high-school seniors, and as of last year, we opened it up to all post-secondary students. Additionally, we increased the gift amounts to \$3,000 and expanded eligibility to grandchildren. Due to the broadened program, we saw a 50% increase in scholarship applicants. Eight of these awards were given to our producers' children, while the other eight were given to our employees' children.

The recipients were selected based on criteria including academic performance, leadership and participation in school, as well as community activities. The program is administered by Scholarship America®, a nonprofit scholarship program administrator, and funded by our Charitable Trust.
